Welcome you to the 25th Annual Rendezvous! We're excited you made the commitment to attend and want to provide you with some fun and helpful information to make sure you fully enjoy your Rendezvous experience.

Rendezvous was first created by Dr. V. Kim Kutsch when he saw the need for an annual meeting where like-minded individuals, who are interested in offering patients the latest dental technologies, materials, and treatment modalities may come together to share ideas to advance the field of evidence-based, minimally-invasive dentistry at an affordable price. He combined this need with his love of the Early American Fur Trappers, aka Mountain Men, into what is known today as the most unique dental CE meeting in the world.

We offer world-class speakers in a very informal atmosphere at a venue with a group size that allows for questions and answers. We limit the number of attendees so that we can focus on making this the best CE event for you. Most speakers stay the entire weekend so that they may learn from other speakers and spend time with all attendees by joining in the fun and festivities. The Mountain Man theme makes for a fun dress code! Fur Hats are all the rage and the most coveted of all door-prizes. Did we forget to tell you that every attendee receives a door-prize ticket when they arrive? Prizes range from Mountain Man Artwork to Native American Jewelry to Fur Hats and Clothing to Pendleton Blankets.

After a person has won a buckle, they are then invited to participate in the Champion of Champion's Competition for a year's worth of bragging rights. The competition is always outside and since its February in Central Oregon, you'll want to dress accordingly. There could be snow, rarely rain, and sometimes a little mud, but you can plan for it being COLD, so please plan your outfits for warmth and a little of everything. We have food and hot beverages available along with a campfire to help keep people warm while waiting their turn to participate.

There's also plenty of free time to enjoy all that the Sisters, Oregon area has to offer.
